Bajaj, Varsha. *Abby Spencer Goes to Bollywood*. Abby looks forward to meeting her father but never imagined he would be the biggest film star in India!

Benjamin, Ali. *The Thing About Jellyfish*. Suzy processes the loss of her best friend by investigating the rare jellyfish she thinks was responsible for her friend's death.

Blackwood, Sage. *Jinx* (series). Jinx encounters magic and danger as he grows up in the dark forest known as the Urwald.

Fitzgerald, Laura Marx. *Under the Egg*. Her grandfather's dying words lead Theodora

Tenpenny to search for a valuable, hidden painting she fears may be stolen.

Graff, Lisa. *Lost in the Sun*. As Trent struggles to move past a traumatic event that took place several months earlier, he befriends class outcast Fallon Little and starts to see things differently.
