PICTURE BOOKS

Beaty, Andrea. **Ada Twist, Scientist.** Ada Twist is a very curious girl who shows perseverance by asking questions and performing experiments to find things out and understand the world.

Bildner, Phil. **Marvelous Cornelius: Hurricane Katrina and the Spirit of New Orleans.** A man known as the “Trashcan Wizard” sings and dances his way through the French Quarter in New Orleans, keeping his beloved city clean, until Hurricane Katrina’s devastation nearly causes him to lose his spirit.

Cordell, Matthew. **Wolf in the Snow.** When a wolf cub and little girl are lost in a snowstorm they must find their way home.

Cunnane, Kelly. **Deep in the Sahara.** An Arab girl of the Sahara who wants to wear a malafa, the veiled dress worn by her mother and older sister, learns that the garment represents beauty, mystery, tradition, belonging, and faith.

Del Arcoiris, Tejedora. **Rainbow Weaver.** Ixchel, a young Mayan girl who is not allowed to use her mother’s thread to weave, exercises her ingenuity and repurposes plastic bags to create colorful weavings.

Denos, Julia. **Windows.** Walking his dog at dusk, one boy catches glimpses of the lives around him in this lovely ode to autumn evenings, exploring your neighborhood, and coming home.

Dyckman, Ame. **Horrible Bear!** When Bear breaks a little girl’s kite, she thinks he is horrible, until she makes a mistake and learns how to say “I’m sorry.”

Garza, Cynthia Leonor. **Lucia the Luchadora.** Lucia comes from a family of luchadoras, the bold and valiant women of the Mexican lucha libre tradition. Cloaked in a flashy disguise, Lucia acts the part of a superhero at recess!

Heder, Thyra. **Alfie: The Turtle That Disappeared.** Told from the perspective of both the girl, Nia, and her pet turtle, Alfie, and describes what happens when he disappears on the eve of her seventh birthday to find her a special present.

Heos, Bridget. **Stegothosaurus.** Stegothosaurus has little in common with his fellow dinosaurs until he meets an allosaurus that seems as hungry for synonyms as he is.

Le, Minh. **Drawn Together.** A boy and his grandfather cross a language and cultural barrier using their shared love of art, storytelling, and fantasy.

McKissack, Patricia C. **What Is Given From the Heart.** Despite their own poverty since Daddy died, Mama tells nine-year-old James Otis they need to help Sarah, whose family lost everything in a fire.

Mora, Oge. **Thank You, Omu!** When the aroma of Omu’s homemade stew fills the air, her neighbors arrive, one by one, for a taste until all is gone except for her generous spirit.

Pizzoli, Greg. **Good Night Owl.** Owl takes drastic measures to have a good night’s sleep.

Santat, Dan. **After the Fall.** After falling off the wall, Humpty Dumpty is very afraid of climbing up again, but is determined not to let fear stop him from being close to the birds.

Slade, Suzanne. **Astronaut Annie.** When Annie has a career day at her school, each member of her family wonders if she will choose their career path—her grandfather the news photographer, her father the mountain climber or her mother the basketball player—until she reveals a dream that is all her own.

Sullivan, John. **Kitten and the Night Watchman.** As he makes his rounds, a night watchman hears birds calling, insects buzzing, and vehicles roaring by, while a stray kitten keeps him company.

Watts, Jeri. **A Piece of Home.** Hee Jun struggles to adjust after moving from Korea to West Virginia, but finds ways to keep family and traditions close.

Woodson, Jacqueline. **The Day You Begin.** Other students laugh when Rigoberto, an immigrant from Venezuela, introduces himself but later, he meets Angelina and discovers that he is not the only one who feels like an outsider.

Yoshitake, Shinsuke. **Still Stuck.** At bath time, a boy who believes he is ready to dress and undress himself gets stuck in his clothes, then imagines what life will be like if he remains that way forever.

Jules, Jacqueline. **Sofia Martinez: Abulea's Birthday** (series) Level 2. Sofia and her cousins are making a piñata for their grandmother's birthday party, but when Bella the cat gets involved chaos ensues.

Becker, Helaine. **Counting on Katherine: How Katherine Johnson Saved Apollo 13** (B JOHNSON). As a child, Katherine Johnson loved to count—everything! Boundless, curious, and excited by calculations, young Katherine longed to know as much as she could about math and about the universe.

Bishop, Nic. **Penguin Day: A Family Story** (598.47 BIS). While his mother is off fishing for food, baby Rockhopper penguin wanders off and almost becomes a meal for a hungry skua—but luckily papa penguin drives off the predator.

De Seve, Karen. **Little Kids First Big Book of Weather** (series 551.5 DE). National Geographic Kids' series explores our world with fascinating facts and incredible illustrations.

Herrera, Juan Felipe. **Imagine** (811.6 HER). When he was very young, Juan Felipe Herrera picked chamomile flowers in windy fields and let tadpoles swim across his hands in a creek. He went to school and taught himself to read and write English. When he grew up, he became the United States Poet Laureate and read his poems aloud on the steps of the Library of Congress.

Kensley, Jessica and Patrick Downes. **Rescue and Jessica: A Life-Changing Friendship** (636.70886 KEN). When he is paired with a human who has lost her legs, Rescue worries that he isn't up to the task of being her service dog.

Kerley, Barbara. **A Little Peace** (327.172 KER). Beautiful photos from around the world with a simple message about our responsibilities for making and keeping peace on the planet.

LaMothe, Matt. **This Is How We Do It: One Day in the Lives of Seven Kids From Around the World** (305.23 LAN). Follow one day in the real lives of seven kids from countries around the world: Italy, Japan, Iran, India, Peru, Uganda, and Russia.

Meadows, Michelle. **Brave Ballerina: The Story of Janet Collins** (B COLLINS). The story of a remarkable pioneer, Janet Collins, who was the first African American prima ballerina in the Metropolitan Opera, during a time when racial segregation was widespread in the United States.

Thompson, Laurie Ann. **Emmanuel's Dream: The True Story of Emmanuel Ofosu Yeboah** (B YEBOAH). The story of a disabled West African youth who pursued an education, helped support his family, and became a record-setting cyclist.

Tonatiuh, Duncan. **Danza! Amalia Hernandez and El Ballet Folklórico de Mexico** (B HERNANDEZ). Danza! is a celebration of Amalia Hernandez's life and of the rich history of dance in Mexico.

Valdez, Patricia. **Joan Procter, Dragon Doctor: The Woman Who Loved Reptiles** (B PROCTER). Discover the inspiring story of Joan Procter, a pioneering female scientist who loved reptiles.
